This workshop aims to share experiences in marine spatial planning in Europe and in Brazil in a governance perspective. 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Short workshop description

PADDLE is a EU RISE-funded research program, coordinated by Dr. Marie Bonnin from IRD (France) involving 11 European partners and 7 associate partners from Brazil, Cape Verde and Senegal. The objective of PADDLE is to analyse opportunities and limits of marine spatial planning in Tropical Atlantic by sharing, integrating and developing knowledge among academics and practitioners from Europe, Brazil and West-Africa (i.e. Senegal and Cape Verde).

The proposed workshop links up to the work in the work package 3 (WP3), entitled “Governance and policy dynamics in tropical MSP”. Researchers involved in this WP employ a legal and socio-political perspective, to better understand (emerging) policy practices, processes and institutional contexts enabling and/or constraining MSP governance dynamics in the transboundary, North-South Atlantic.

From the perspective of the PADDLE researchers, the workshop has three main aims:

- Informing workshop participants about the insights gained through the review work of institutional arrangements, legal frameworks, coastal and marine policies at the national, regional and international level, with particular focus on Tropical Atlantic (task 3.1)
- Gathering information (examples, experiences) from relevant stakeholders for the mapping of relevant policies for (future) MSP in Brazil (task 3.2)
- Mobilizing knowledge, exchanging viewpoints and discussing different perspectives to derive at insights or guidelines important for the development, designation and implementation of MSP in the Tropical Atlantic (task 3.3/3.4)

For the participants, the workshop will provide:

- Enhanced understanding in MSP as (new) policy paradigm
- Enhanced knowledge about current practices and policies relevant for Brazil, Senegal and Cabo Verde (on the national, regional and international level)
- Room to contribute to constructive critical thinking about future development, designation and implementation of MSP in tropical Atlantic.

The project’s implementation and networking allowed to open-up to other projects working on the same themes. In result, we chose to expand this workshop’s scope and to cooperate with other projects in the same field.
